

FRAUD PREVENTION: KEY TAKEAWAYS FROM THE OTTAWA POLICE SERVICE

With Sgt. Doug Mirau

At the October 8 General Meeting, Sergeant Doug Mirau of the Ottawa Police Service delivered an engaging presentation on fraud and identity theft—a growing issue affecting Canadians of all ages, especially seniors.

Sgt. Mirau reminded members that fraud is "taking something by deceit," and that scammers use fear, trust, and urgency to trick victims into sharing money or personal information. Common schemes include CRA and bank impostor calls, "grandparent" scams, and online marketplace overpayments.

He emphasized a few **simple safeguards**:

- Never share personal or banking details by phone or email.
- Shred financial papers and review your credit report regularly.
- No government or police agency will ever demand payment by gift card or cryptocurrency.

A Final Message


Sgt. Mirau closed with simple, but powerful advice:

ARM Chapter 25 General Meeting — October 8, 2025

ARM Chapter 25 members gathered for the biennial General Meeting on October 8, 2025, at the Hilton Garden Inn, Ottawa Airport. The meeting provided an opportunity to celebrate achievements, recognize service, and plan for the next phase in the life of our vibrant chapter.

Leadership Transition

The meeting marked the end of Dina van den Hanenberg's term as President. In her final report, Dina reflected on the Chapter's strong record of advocacy, community giving, and member engagement throughout her tenure. She highlighted key initiatives such as local charitable donations totaling more than \$20,000, partnerships with OTIP/RTIP and Educators Financial Group, and active participation in provincial ARM Council discussions and the 2025 ARM Biennial.

With nominations closed and all positions acclaimed, Les Robinson assumed the role of President, with Clare O'Connell Noon as Treasurer and Judith Miller as Secretary.

Highlights from Reports

The Chapter's ongoing success in member communication and outreach was evident in the Webmaster's Report, which showed more than 1,000 annual website visits and over 2,500 page views. The most frequently visited pages were the Homepage, Upcoming Events, and Newsletter sections. These analytics demonstrate that members are actively engaging with online content, particularly around events such as the General Meeting, Golf Tournament, and Breakfast Socials.

Advocacy and Future Focus

Incoming President Les Robinson

previewed the upcoming 2025–2026 program year, which will feature an OTIP/RTIP update in January, a combined EFG Estate Planning session and holiday luncheon in December, and the return of the popular East and West Breakfast Socials in February. Planning is also underway for a special 30th Anniversary Celebration in May, marking three decades of fellowship, advocacy, and community among ARM members.
